- Willing to following the Code of Ethics

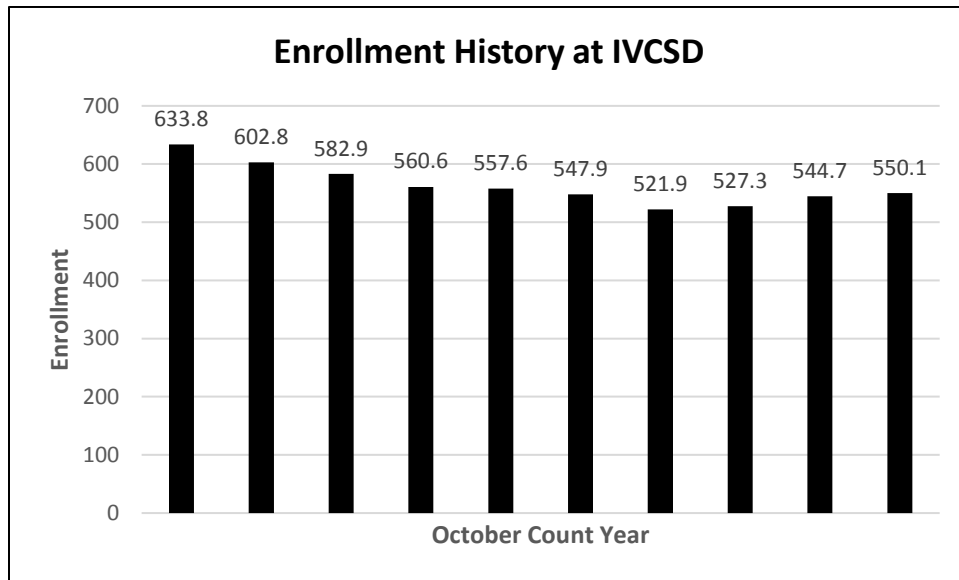

Enrollment History at Iowa Valley CSD

The General Fund is the most common fund type and is “student driven,” meaning it relies on certified enrollment figures. Certified enrollment is determined each October of every school year. Our certified enrollment count is up by 5.4 students but we are down 1.0 for students being provided services in our district. Our PK4 numbers are up by 10 students, resident student numbers who attend another public school district are up 2.4 students (down from the previous school year by 15.0 students), and non-resident students who attend our district is down by 4 students.

Opioid Training

I attended the opioid training at the Sigourney Public Library on October 26. Keokuk EMT hosted this event and Dr. Chris Buresh from the U of I Emergency Department presented information about the opioid epidemic and each trainee received free Naloxone (Narcon) rescue kits, one for each building. It was a very interesting workshop.
